

- God appears in the fire – a good illustration of 2 aspects of his character
- 1. A God of the Broken and the Needy**
- Fire – warms, comforts and gives life. 5 soul-warming aspects:
 - a) **The God who comes – v1-10**
 - God is not oblivious to the troubles of his people – v7, 8, 16
 - Picture of Jesus coming to rescue enslaved peoples – 1st coming
 - Reminder that Christ will come again to finally rescue - 2nd coming
 - b) **The God who calls – v4, 15-17**
 - Summons Moses – He still calls today so that we can have life
 - c) **The God who is constant – v8, 14**
 - Bush doesn't burn up, this flame is everlasting – illustrating God
 - His name "I Am" reinforces his unchangingness
 - He is the great promise keeping God who doesn't change - always there
 - d) **The God who cares, corrects and equips – 3:12-4:17**
 - Moses gives a series of 5 excuses. God answers:
 - God cares – he answers Moses' fears
 - God corrects – Moses asks about Moses, God answers about God
 - God equips – When God commands he also equips (Miracles, Aaron)
 - Have you ever felt God is asking too much? He is the God of the fearful
 - e) **The God who conquers v16-22**
 - Pharaoh is defeated before he begins. Likewise Christ has already won
- 2. A God not to be messed with**
- Too often we make assumptions about God, and treat him lightly.
 - Fire is dangerous. "*Of course he's not safe*" – CS Lewis
 - God underlines his holiness to Moses in 5 ways
 - Fire - Fire deserves a healthy respect - likewise God
 - Sandals - Moses told to show respect and stay back
The unholy cannot mix with the Holy
 - Victory - Pharaoh will learn that God is not to be treated lightly
 - Excuses - God is patient, but only for so long.
4:14 – Continued excuses for obedience provokes God
 - Circumcision - Moses seems to have disregarded God's command (4:24-26) God won't tolerate sloppiness towards his law
 - When sin & holiness collide there is only one winner. Our only hope is Jesus who offers to take our sin & give his holiness so we can come to God
 - Christians must never treat Christ's donated holiness lightly – we must live to honour it. Don't make assumptions about God, or put him in a box
